

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
March 10, 2016 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 10, 2016 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: John Zias, Tim Boots and James Radich. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall, Solicitor Greg Fox and two visitors were present.

Chairman John Zias called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance. Visitor's comments: Sam Pawlowski-guide rail was repaired on River Road; Dave Weller-Magee Road is falling apart – the large trucks are not using it.

Zias motioned and Boots second to accept the minutes of the February 11, 2016 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor. Boots motioned and Zias second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor. The Roadmaster and Permit reports were presented.

Boots motioned and Zias second to purchase a new street sweeper for the skid steer for no more than \$6,000. Motion passed with all in favor. Marshall is to check on a pull behind sweeper while at the PSATS State Convention and to refer them to Boots for a contact for the township.

There was discussion about a resident wishing to sell ice cream from a van and whether they would be required to get a solicitation permit. Under the advice of the Solicitor it was agreed that the township would not.

Boots motioned and Radich second to adopt the amended employee policy dated March 10, 2016 and that copies will be presented to the road employees and secretary/treasurer. Motion passed with all in favor.

Zias motioned and Boots second to pass the Hazardous Mitigation Plan Resolution # 3-10-16 which approves the adoption of the Lawrence County Hazardous Mitigation Plan for Perry Township. Motion passed with all in favor.

The use of Auto Plus for parts and their delivery was discussed for township needs with Boots questioning their availability on weekends.

The 2016 Liquid Fuels allotment has been received with it being the largest to date. The PennDOT District 11-0 mailed out information on the township bridges for inspections.

The contract with Costars will require at least one more load of salt to be delivered to reach the township quota.

A meeting will be held on April 6 here concerning the replacement of the second bridge. A USDA Grant/Loan program was discussed and contact was received from 422 Sales to see if the township had any equipment/vehicles for sale.

Boots motioned and Radich second to purchase an eight foot leveling machine from Smardt Equipment to go onto the front end of the skid steer for \$1,700. Motion passed with all in favor.

The county judicial tax sale is May 6 and the township is to request a list of the properties from Perry Township.

Boots motioned and Zias second to proceed with the ordinance advertisement for the adoption of the Central Booking Ordinance. Motion passed with all in favor.

Greg Fox briefly discussed the Lawrence County COG attempting to sell the asphalt zipper and that he felt that a meeting for all the solicitors representing those involved, was not necessary since the zipper is owned by the municipalities who jointly purchased it.

The building gutter was worked on by Boots under the construction contract. Boots is to check on the Praxair account. Penn Power is to be contacted about putting up an additional light on Portersville Road between #712 and 716. Some of the street lights have been replaced and the residents have commented favorably.

The culvert replacement for Van Gorder Mill Road was discussed with Boots to contact the contractor about trying to move it back until after school is out. The summer bid amounts have been submitted to the COG for advertisement/bidding.

Zias motioned and Boots second to adjourn. Motion passed.
