

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
July 13, 2017 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 13, 2017 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: Tim Boots and James Radich. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall and six visitors were present.

Vice-Chairman Tim Boots called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance. Visitor's comments: Sam Pawlowski-roller location, Pfeifer Road, road work; Jenny Urbanic-complaint about the Miller property at the end of Hickernell Road – junk trailer and campers (Supervisors are to have letter sent to owner; Roy Magee-ditch on Barkley Road, everyone expressed appreciation for his being able to attend and wished him and Jeff Cable well; Helen Boots-discontent with the Tax Collector not being able or posting information about the delay for paying taxes, felt she should be replaced; Roger Hogue-thank you for the Hilltop Lane and new Bash Lane signs, thank you to the fire department for their assistance in helping with an incident on Hilltop Lane; George McCool-thank you for the ditch work on Reno Road by his property.

Boots motioned and Radich second to accept the minutes of the June 8, 2017 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor. Radich motioned and Boots second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor. The Roadmaster and Permit reports were presented.

Boots motioned and Radich second for the township deputy tax collector, Janice Marshall to be added to the Dorothy Wallace Tax Collection Account as an authorized signer and that all other information remain the same on the account. The township and school taxes can be paid at the township office 8-1:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday and those needing a different time can contact the township office for an appointment. Motion passed with all in favor.

It was announced that a \$7,000.00 grant was approved by the Lawrence County Commissioners for the widening of McCartney Hollow Road across from the slide area that closed the road.

It was announced that Trudy Wigton has been approved for low income housing repairs to her house.

A complaint was received about the Gettleman property on Armstrong Road where public pool parties are being held from 2 p.m. to 3 a.m.

The Supervisors reviewed the various items carried over from previous meetings and their status.

The McCartney Hollow widening project is pending the township engineer providing guidance to the location of the right of way, the moving of an electric pole and approvals from the property owners.

Radich motioned and Boots second to adjourn. Motion passed.
