

Perry Township Board of Supervisors  
August 10, 2017 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 10, 2017 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: John Zias, Tim Boots and James Radich. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall, Solicitor Greg Fox and one visitor was present.

Vice-Chairman Tim Boots called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance. Visitor's comments: none were received.

Boots motioned and Radich second to accept the minutes of the July 13, 2017 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor. Boots motioned and Radich second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor. The Roadmaster, Tax Collection and Permit reports were presented.

Following numerous complaints from the residents on Studebaker Road and neighbors of Kimberly Shaffer, the Supervisors agreed to send a letter to Ms. Shaffer recommending that she contain her pet pigs on her property by installing an adequate fence to keep them off of the neighbor's properties. Failure to do so, will involve the animal control officer to proceed with filing violations of the nuisance ordinance with the district magistrate.

Following numerous complaints about the condition of the Tim and Jeanne Hardy property at 224 Reno Road, the Supervisors agreed to send a letter about the condition of the property and junk vehicles located on the property. A copy of the nuisance ordinance is to be sent.

Following a burning complaint at the David Burns property at 707 Portersville Road, the Supervisors agreed to send him a letter and a copy of the burning ordinance and request he comply with the ordinance.

The McCartney Hollow widening project is pending the township engineer providing guidance to the location of the right of way, the moving of an electric pole and approvals from the property owners.

A letter was received about the bad intersection at Pleasant Hill and State Route 488 from PennDot with their recommendations for the township and for PennDot to put signs up at the location. They are to be contacted to see why it is the township's responsibility to clear the brush along State Route 488 when it is obstructing the visibility for Route 488, Pleasant Hill and North Tower Road which are all state roads.

The asphalt zipper ownership was discussed with Jan to set up a possible meeting with the owners after the COG meeting on September 27.

Martha Miller/Linda Angus has been contacted and given a deadline of September 1 to have the campers and trailers removed from their property on Hickernell Road. Will give one month for the campers and two months for the trailers to be removed.

The COG lawsuit with Code.sys has been settled. A meeting is set for 10:00 a.m. on September 27<sup>th</sup> to discuss the future of the COG.

The Supervisors reviewed the various items carried over from previous meetings and their status.

Boots motioned and Radich second to adjourn. Motion passed.
