

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
June 13, 2019 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 13, 2019 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: Tim Boots, James Radich and John Zias. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall, Solicitor Greg Fox and five visitors were present.

Chairman John Zias called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Visitor's comments: Barry Kline and Brad Braham – flooding from behind homes, large culvert pipe is overflowing, flooding garages, driveways, etc. – pipe at 488 not large enough for Mercer Road and hillside water flow area when been getting in 2-3 inches at a time, asking for help with problem. Boots to meet with the township Solicitor to look at the problem next week. Adam Pochak-asking for assistance in extending the Armstrong Cable further down Stickle Road for better internet access – told to contact Armstrong himself to see what they will do then get back to the township. Lisa Gagliano- presented petition to the Supervisors from the residents on Grandview Road asking for work to be done on Grandview Road: the area from Boots driveway down to Hazens: complaint requested ditching, widening, removal of bump in road, and guiderails. Boots said would address bump in next two weeks and would address the remainder by end of August.

Zias motioned and Radich second to accept the minutes of the May 9, 2019 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor.

Radich motioned and Zias second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor.

The Roadmaster and Permit reports were presented. Roadmaster Tim Boots commented during the public comment period that he is proposing to tar and chip the lower end of Mile Hill Road from Sinclair Lane to Route 488, Stickle Road and Magee Road.

Boots motioned and Zias second to increase the lawn mowing/trimming to \$40.00 per cutting. Motion passed with Boots and Zias in favor and Radich abstaining.

Complaints about the two properties with junk on them was discussed and both owners are working on cleaning them up after receiving certified letters from the township. As long as they continue to work at the clean-up the Supervisors are satisfied.

Boots motioned and Zias second to purchase the extended warranty protection plan which includes an aftertreatment coverage and transmission coverage for the 2019 Peterbilt truck purchased. Motion passed with all in favor.

The situation was discussed concerning the Tony Agostinelli trailer and campers located on Hickernell Road. The trailer has been bought and is being dismantled.

Governor Wolf is pushing for income from municipalities who do not have own police coverage and use only the State Police. Perry Township would be charged \$8.00 per each of the 1,871 residents which would equal \$14,968 per year.

Boots motioned and Radich second to approve the possible location of a temporary trailer and septic under the "Hardship and Granny Plat Regulations" on the property of Urbanic on Hickernell Road should they decide to proceed with it. An agreement will need to be completed that states that the trailer and septic would only be there until the resident moves out then it must be removed and the septic tapped off. Motion passed with all in favor.

Boots motioned and Radich second to adjourn. Motion passed.
