

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
July 8, 2021 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 8, 2021 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: John Zias, Tim Boots and James Radich. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall, one visitor present. Visitor Comments: Sam Pawlowski, River Road-Dovidio driveway runoff onto

Vice-Chairman Tim Boots called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance. Radich motioned and Zias second to accept the minutes of the June 10, 2021 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor. Zias motioned and Radich second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor.

The \$10,584.88 funds were received from the PUC Gas Well distribution.

Boots motioned and Radich second to pay Andrea Daufen \$3,300.00 toward tree removal on her property on McCartney Hollow Road in place of installing fence or shrubbery for the agreement from the road widening project involving her property. A letter is to be given to Andrea and Kim Daufen to sign prior to the check being given to them. Motion passed with all in favor.

It was announced that the application to Lawrence County for financial assistance in the equipment purchase was denied. The equipment load paperwork has been completed and the equipment ordered from Stephenson Equipment and should be delivered mid-July.

It was announced that there was a problem with the County processing of the Per Capita bills and some were sent out in duplicate.

All the paperwork is completed for the American Rescue Fund and the application approved by DCED. The township has received their SAM number but it must be renewed every year.

It was also announced that the Ellwood City Area School District has changed the company that will be collecting the delinquent taxes for the school taxes. It is important that residents get their taxes paid as the failure to do so will result in large penalty amounts and even the possibility of the company being able to sell the property.

A number of complaints have been received and certified letters are to be sent to them:

Status: Nothing heard yet: The District 11-0 representatives contacted the Township about the water problem at the intersection of Mercer Road, Portersville Road and Palo Alto Drive. Documentation was sent to them that PennDot was to have taken care of the problem through an Agility Project for when Perry Township provided winter snow removal in 2017-2018 on Pleasant Hill Road.

Radich motioned and Zias second to adjourn. Motion passed.
