

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
August 9, 2018 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 9, 2018 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: Tim Boots and James Radich. John Zias was absent. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall, Solicitor Greg Fox and two visitors were present.

Vice-Chairman Tim Boots called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance. Visitor's comments: Sam Pawlowski- location of second Barkley Road Bridge being worked on, new truck, second bridge update.

Radich motioned and Boots second to accept the minutes of the July 12, 2018 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor. Radich motioned and Boots second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills.

The Roadmaster report and permit reports were presented.

The Sturgeon family finally removed their junk truck off of the Bates Road right of way.

Radich motioned and Boots second to accept the bid from Russell Standard for the equipment rental for the summer tar and chipping projects. Motion passed. To do Breakneck Bridge, Bates and possibly Magee Roads.

It was announced that the PSATS President Bill Hawk passed away and the township condolences were sent.

Boots motioned and Radich second to approve the request from the WPVFD for release of approximately \$40,000 for the purchase of a new pick-up truck for fire department response to calls, training, etc. Motion passed.

The need for at least one township supervisor to be trained in the NIM's 100 and 700 was discussed. Failure to do so, would result in possible financial assistance problems with FEMA in the event of an emergency.

The new 2018 F-550 Ford truck and plow has been received. Total cost: \$81,360.

The Miller property complaint status was discussed with the decision for the solicitor to proceed with filing at the courthouse when the 30 day limit is up.

Following the motion at the July meeting, Supervisors Boots and Radich and the Solicitor agreed that the letter is to be sent to the other four owners of the asphalt zipper notifying them that Perry Township will not be renewing the insurance on it in December and wish to remove their name as part owner due to the conflict Mahoning Township has created.

Boots commented that he is still waiting for Penn Power to move the pole on McCartney Hollow Road so the widening of the road can be done.

Solicitor Greg Fox is to check into the Augustine property at 112 Whieldon Avenue to see what can be done due to lack of maintenance. The certified letter was returned.

The Hardy property on Reno Road had part of the weeds mowed but there is still trash laying around.

The WPVFD members thanked the Supervisors for repairing the garage roof attached to the township building.

The replacement of a small bridge by 2221 Barkley Road is nearing completion and expected to open on August 20th.

Boots motioned and Radich second to adjourn. Motion passed.
