

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
September 10, 2020 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 10, 2020 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: James Radish and Tim Boots. John Zias was absent for medical issues. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall was in attendance. Two visitors were present. Vice-Chairman Tim Boots called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Visitors Comments: Samuel Pawlowski – Hufnagel barn burnt, how Zias is doing, sweeper use. Lynn LeViere from the Municipal Authority discussed repair projects for the sewer station.

Radich motioned and Boots second to accept the minutes of the August 13, 2020 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor.

Radich motioned and Boots second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor.

The Roadmaster, Tax Collection Report and other permit reports were presented. Boots announced that the road crew is working to open Nye Road back up.

The estimated Liquid Fuels income for 2021 is \$110,141.95 plus the Turn Back income of \$15,360.

The township has begun the process of the seven year review of the Agricultural Security Area. There will be several changes in the property owners participating.

The McCartney Hollow Road widening project has been completed and the \$7,000 grant has been received from the Lawrence County Commissioners.

A request has been received for a mirror to be placed again at the intersection of Pfeifer Road at 488 due to poor visibility. The Supervisors agreed to have one put back up.

The Perry Township Municipal Authority notified the Supervisors that Jim Creese resigned from the Authority Board and they asked for Ron Miller to be appointed in his place. Boots motioned and Radich to appoint Miller to accept the resignation of Creese and to appoint Miller to the Authority Board. Motion passed.

The county recycling department announced that there is a special collection on September 19 in Mercer County and September 26 in Lawrence County. Those wishing to take items must register ahead of time. The exact location will not be made public.

Boots motioned and Radich second to purchase a plasma cutter and equipment for it for the shop at the cost of up to \$5,000.00. Motion passed.

Radich motioned and Boots second to adjourn. Motion passed.
