

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
February 10, 2022 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 10, 2022 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: John Zias, Tim Boots and James Radich. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall and Solicitor Thomas Smith were present. One visitor was present.

Chairman John Zias called the meeting to order assisted by Vice-Chairman Tim Boots beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance. Visitor's comments: Sam Pawlowski-discussed the moving wall coming to Ellwood City Area and discussed his more than 30 years of service to the area.

Radich motioned and Zias second to accept the minutes of the January 3, 2022 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor. Zias motioned and Radich second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor.

A report was received from the township auditors – Supervisor compensation was set at \$17.00/hour for Roadmaster and working Supervisor was set at \$16.00/hour and the reimbursement for mileage is set at the federal rate of \$.585 per mile.

The Roadmaster, Tax Collection and Permit reports were presented.

There was discussion concerning a request from Perry School to make Riffer Street one way into the school between 3-4 p.m. for the safety of students and busses leaving the school. The matter was tabled for further investigation.

The Lawrence County Tax Outreach Day will be held at the Perry Township Municipal Building on March 23 from 10:00-12:00 for the payment of 2022 Lawrence County Taxes.

Boots motioned and Radich second to ratify the appointment on January 4th of Skyler Campbell as Auditor until the next municipal election. Motion passed with all in favor.

Zias motioned and Boots second to pass the Health Insurance and Covid Payroll Time-Off Expense Policy for Perry Township Employees. Motion passed with all in favor.

The township is to check into setting the Clean-up Day time and agreed that the fee for drop off to be the same- \$10.00 per regular size load and \$50.00 for large loads, with no large trucks permitted.

Discussion of getting a Geo-thermal System for the township building was tabled with Boots to check on options and cost.

The US Treasury has finally set the allowable use of the American Rescue Plan funds effective April 1st and if receiving under \$10,000,000.00 can use it for any allowable expense other than pensions, putting in a cash reserve. Should watch for more detailed list of items not permitted.

The Costar Salt contract has been submitted for the 2022-23 year – 60 tons.

Zias motioned to adjourn the meeting and Boots Second. Motion passed.
