

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
March 10, 2022 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 10, 2022 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: John Zias, Tim Boots and James Radich. Secretary/Treasurer Janice Marshall and Solicitor Thomas Smith were present. Two visitors were present.

Chairman John Zias called the meeting to order assisted by Vice-Chairman Tim Boots beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was held in memory of road laborer Glenn Czerpak who passed away March 3. Visitor's comments: Sam Pawlowski- River Road driveway that is putting water onto the roadway and expressed sympathy to the Czerpak family.

Zias motioned and Boots second to accept the minutes of the February 10, 2022 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor. Zias motioned and Boots second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor. It was noted that Herrmann & Loll are in the process of auditing the books for the township and the tax collector.

The Roadmaster, Tax Collection and Permit reports were presented.

There was discussion concerning a request from Perry School to make Riffer Street one way into the school between 3-4 p.m. for the safety of students and busses leaving the school. Zias motioned and Radich second to make a portion of Riffer Street one way coming out of Perry Elementary School and to have signs installed at the Meadowland/Riffer Street Intersection. A possible ordinance and study is to be completed if necessary. Motion passed with all in favor.

The Lawrence County Tax Outreach Day will be held at the Perry Township Municipal Building on March 23 from 10:00-12:00 for the payment of 2022 Lawrence County Taxes.

Discussion of a solicitation request from Sunny Day Treats, LLC to operate an ice cream truck in the township. Boots motioned and Radich second to issue a solicitation permit to Sunny Day Treats, LLC after the proper paperwork/application is received with a \$50.00 fee. Motion passed with all in favor.

The township set June 4th for the annual Clean-up Day from 8-12:00 and agreed that the fee for drop off to be the same- \$10.00 per regular size load and \$50.00 for large loads, with no large trucks permitted.

Telephone Bids were received for a Geo-thermal System for the township office building. Boots motioned and Radich second to award the bid to Stewart Well Drilling in the amount of \$20,448.00 to install and complete a geo-thermal system for the township building office/meeting area to include heat and air conditioning for cleaner air system. Motion passed with all in favor.

Boots is to contact the residents on Palo Alto Drive to keep their vehicles off the streets especially in the winter months.

Items received after the posted agenda needing action were:

Boots motioned and Zias second to add discussion and action for the Jerrold Frank septic agreement items. Motion passed.

Boots motioned and Zias second to pass Resolution 3-10-22 for plan revision for Jerold Franks New Land Development. Motion Passed.

Boots motioned and Radich second to add request from the Ellwood City Egg Hunt Committee to the agenda. Motion passed.

Boots motioned and Zias second to make a donation of \$100.00 to the Ellwood City Easter Egg Hunt Committee. Motion passed.

Boots motioned and Zias second to add the inter fund transfer to the agenda. Motion passed. Boots motioned and Zias second to transfer \$80,000 from the General savings to the Capital Reserve CD. Motion passed.

It was announced that there is an executive session at for personnel matters at 5:05 p.m. and that the regular meeting was continued at 5:40 p.m.

Boots motioned and Zias second to pay Lisa Czerpak the budgeted benefits for Glenn Czerpak for 2022. Motion passed.

Boots motioned to adjourn the meeting and Zias Second. Motion passed.
