

Perry Township Board of Supervisors
April 13, 2023 Regular Meeting Minutes

The Perry Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 13, 2023 at the Perry Township Municipal Building. Supervisors in attendance were: Tim Boots and James Radich. Secretary/Treasurer Brandie Massioni and Solicitor Thomas Smith were present. 8 visitors were present.

Chairman John Zias called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance. Visitor's comments: Jeffrey Markle discussed concerns about garbage along road by his home. Christine Barr discussed her concerns about garbage and township burning days. Dolores Zadalak discussed her concern for the school traffic and safety in front of her house.

Zias motioned and Boots second to accept the minutes of the March 9 2023 meeting. Motion passed with all in favor. Zias motioned and Boots second to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Motion passed with all in favor. It was reported that the auditor Herrmann and Loll has completed the 2022 Financial Audit with no findings reported.

The Roadmaster and Permit reports were presented.

The summer products bids were opened. Zias motioned and Boots second to accept the low bids for the summer products. Motion passed. Results were:

Aggregates: McClymonds Supply & Transit: 800 tons #8-\$26.32/ton; 300 tons #57-\$22.67; 300 tons R-3 Rip Rap-\$22.67; 100 tons R-4 Rip Rap-\$22.67; 100 tons R-5 Rip Rap-\$37.85.

Emulsions: Russell Standard-50 tons Premium Cold Patch-\$102.00; Russell Standard-30,000 gallons FOB CRS-2 Emulsion-\$2.80; 20,000 gallons delivered CRS-2 Emulsion-\$2.25.

Fuels – Reed Oil-LS-6000 gallons on-road Diesel-\$ 2.90; and 2000 gallons heating oil-\$2.91.

Boots motioned and Zias second to ratify submission of county liquid fuels resolution 4-13-2023 to the Lawrence County Commissioners requesting \$30,000.00 in a grant for purchase of 2023 Ford F-550 truck. Motion passed with all in favor.

Zias motioned and Boots second to adopt the ordinance # 4-13-23 Tall Grass and Weeds. Motion passed with all in favor.

The annual Clean-up Day is April 29th from 8-12:00 at parking lots of township building and WPVFD. All agreed that the fee for drop off to be the same- \$10.00 per regular size load and \$50.00 for large loads, with no large trucks permitted.

The county blighted program that helped with demolition of 710 Tara Drive is now completed and township has been reimbursed from the county.

Zias motioned to adjourn the meeting and Radich Second. Motion passed.
